A. CALL TO ORDER

The meeting was called to order by Supervisor Bloomfield at 7:30 pm, followed by the Pledge of Allegiance.

D. OLD BUSINESS:

1. DISCUSS AND APPROVE RESOLUTION TO AUTHORIZE THE SUPERVISOR TO SIGN THE "DEVELOPERS AGREEMENT" AND THE "RIGHT-OF-WAY" AGREEMENT IN REFERENCE TO THE HERITAGE/NY FARMS. LLC PROJECT.

Responding to questions over the ownership of this project, Mr. Walker distributed a memo to the Board Members clarifying the issue. Before June of 2005, the landowner was Afton Properties and the applicant is Heritage at Goshen, LLC. As of June 2005 the land owner is NY Farms, LLC of Red Bank, New Jersey. Michael Walker, who resides in Chester, is the managing member representing both the land owner and the project. According to the memo Mr. Walker stated, "The project is formally known as Heritage Estates. We decided to use the name "The Heritage" after we were advised that there is a project in the Village of Goshen called "Heritage Estates".

Attorney Caplicki reviewed and explained the "Developers Agreement and the "Right-Of-Way" Agreement, as discussed at the June 11th work session.

WHEREAS, New York Farms, LLC has previously applied to the Planning Board of the Town of Goshen and other related Federal, State, and County agencies for approvals to construct a 75 unit clustered residential development on Old Chester Road in Goshen, N.Y. to be known as "Heritage Estates", and

WHEREAS, in connection with the design, planning, and construction of the Heritage Estates project it has been determined that water and sewer service to the project would best be served by/through an expansion of the existing Town of Goshen Sewer and Water District(s) No. 1 (Hambletonian Park) so as to include in said district(s), in substantial part, the units in the Heritage Estates project, and

WHEREAS, NY Farms, LLC and the Town wish to enter an agreement which will set forth the obligations of NY Farms, LLC and the Town with respect to the design, construction and operation of the sewer and water systems for the project as same will be integrated into the existing district(s), Exhibit A annexed and

WHEREAS, in connection with the development and construction of the Heritage Estates project, the Town wishes to receive from the developer certain transfers and dedications of certain real property parcels, Exhibit B annexed,

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Town Board of the Town of Goshen does hereby approve the terms of the attached Developer's Agreement (Exhibit A) and the Right-of-Way Abandonment Agreement (Exhibit B) and that the Supervisor of the Town of Goshen is hereby authorized to sign same on behalf of the Town of Goshen and any and all additional documents necessary to effectuate the terms of this resolution.

Attorney Caplicki reviewed the matter of the extension of the Town of Goshen water and sewer districts No.1-known as the "Hambletonian Park Sewer and Water Districts," Pursuant to Article 12A of the Town Law.

Councilman Louis Cappella made the motion to accept the Resolution approving the extension of the districts pursuant to Town Law Section 209-e. Councilman George Lyons seconded the motion.

E. NEW BUSINESS

1. PRESENT TO THE BOARD A LIST OF JRC POTENTIAL CAPITAL PROJECTS

Kevin Armistead, representing the JRC, reviewed a list of *potential* capital projects for the parks. The list for **Craigville Park** includes: (1) signs renaming the park the "Myron Urbanski Memorial Park", (2) correct the drainage on the left side of the major field, (3) correct the drainage and resurface Cassel field, (4) correct the drainage on the two main soccer fields which are off the second entrance. Currently, perimeter drains are being installed on both fields (looped) as part of Phase I. Phase II will be raising-up the fields to install lateral pipes for proper drainage. (5) rehab (re-pave) the walkway that runs 36" wide x 608' length, from the playground to the back of the field, and (6) pave the driveway/parking lot. There are no plans to pave the back parking lots. Those lots serve for drainage. Councilman Canterino asked if a basketball court could be installed in the future. The list for **Salesian Park**, which will be a joint decision with the Village, includes: (1) demolish school building, (2) establish one recreational playing field, changing this park from being passive to active, attracting more visitors, (3) aerator or a compound to remove scum from the pond, (4) renovate the walkways/paths and (5) pave the entrance driveway.

The Erie Street Park and Lions Park are in the Village. Erie Street Park is used a lot. This park is in need of updating the skateboard and basketball sections. Lions Park could use additional picnic tables and brush removal.

Mr. Armistead commented that Broderick Knoell, Superintendent of Highways, has been very helpful by providing assistance whenever possible. Finally, the new scoreboard, at Craigville Park, will be dedicated on June 23 at 10:30am.

2. REVIEW AND DISCUSS EMPLOYEES DENTAL AND VISION PLAN INSURANCE PREMIUM INCREASES AND AUTHORIZE THE SUPERVISOR TO SIGN A CONTRACT RENEWAL FOR THE SAME

Supervisor Bloomfield reviewed the CSEA Employee Benefit Fund increases in the dental plan and in the vision plan per employee – per month. The Horizon Dental Plan is at the current rate of \$80.62 and will increase to \$83.84. The Platinum 12 Vision Plan is at the current rate of \$23.39 and will increase to \$23.62.

Councilman Lyons made the motion to authorize the Supervisor to sign for the increase premiums in the Horizon Dental Plan and Platinum 12 Vision Plan. Councilman Cappella seconded the motion.

3. AUTHORIZE THE SUPERVISOR TO SIGN AN AGREEMENT WITH WRIGHT RISK MANAGEMENT FOR "RUNOFF CLAIMS MANAGEMENT" FOR 2012, RATES REMAIN THE SAME AS LAST YEAR

Supervisor Bloomfield explained that as of December 31, 2011, the Town has 7 Tail Claims managed by Wright Risk Management. A memo to the Town stated that the fees will remain the same as last year which is at the rate of \$500 each, per year.

Councilman Canterino made the motion to authorize the Supervisor to sign the Workers' Compensation Claims Runoff Management Agreement. Councilman Lyons seconded the motion.

4. DISCUSS AND APPROVE A RESOLUTION TO AUTHORIZE THE SUPERVISOR TO REQUEST SPEED LIMIT CHANGES ON COUNTY ROUTE 6/PULASKI HIGHWAY AND TO SUGGEST INSTALLATION OF A TRAFFIC LIGHT BY THE NYS DOT AT THE 17A/PULASKI HIGHWAY INTERSECTION

It was discussed at Monday's meeting to lower the speed limit between Indiana Road to Pumpkin Swamp Road from 55 mph to 45mph and to increase the speed limit between Pumpkin Swamp Road to Cross Road from 35mph to 45mph. It was also discussed to recommend that a traffic signal be installed at the intersection of County Road 6/Pulaski Highway and Route 17A.
