A. CALL TO ORDER

The meeting was called to order by Supervisor Bloomfield at 7:30 PM.


Supervisor Bloomfield gave a report from the Orange County Executive's daily briefing, apprising of the count of COVID-19 cases and death totals for the day. IDA webinar for small businesses is setting aside \$500,000 for small business relief. The maximum allotted for each business is \$10,000 per business with twenty-five (25) or fewer employees and \$2,500,000 annual revenue. Interest for the loan for the first six months is 0% and after six months is 2.5%. Supervisor Bloomfield reports that Milmar Inc., a Town of Goshen food processing company donated 2,000 meals to the Orange County Office of the Aging on Wednesday, April 22nd. The Town Police has been quiet, with very little road traffic nor traffic citations. Highway department Spring clean-up has been delayed due to staffing shortages. Supervisor Bloomfield asked if it is noticed that neighbors are placing bulk items on their curbside to let them know that the pickup is delayed and to bring their items inside or out of the way. Police Chief McDowell has noted that the public is doing a good job of wearing masks and social distancing.

Supervisor Bloomfield read a letter from Debra Corr. She asked: 1.) to the Town Board and the Planning Board to please extend building permit extensions for six months for residents without fees. Attorney Torre remarked when asked by the Supervisor that as per the Town Code, the length of expiration for building permits is eighteen months from the date of issuance and can be extended or renewed for six month periods after that. Attorney Torre noted that she sent a
