

The Regular Meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Goshen was held on the 10th day of April, 2006 at 7:30 p.m. in the Town Hall located at 41 Webster Avenue, Village of Goshen, County of Orange, State of New York.

A. CALL TO ORDER

Supervisor Bloomfield called the meeting to order at 7:40 p.m., following the Work Session Meeting and Budget Officer William Standish led the Pledge of Allegiance.

B AMENDMENT TO THE AGENDA: Supervisor Bloomfield announced there would be two amendments to the agenda, both to be tabled.

1. Under Old Business: C. Resolution to Ban Highway Equipment
2. Under New Business #2 on the agenda, Submission of Two Parcels for PDR Matching Grants From the County of Orange

C. PRIVILEGE OF THE FLOOR (agenda items only) No Response

D. PUBLIC HEARING: WATER DISTRICT NO. I (HAMBLETONIAN PARK WATER MAIN REPLACEMENT)

Councilman Lyons made a Motion to open the Public Hearing. The Motion was seconded by Councilman Canterino. Motion carried 4 to 0.

Supervisor Bloomfield introduced Al Fusco P. E., from Fusco Engineering & Land Surveying. He explained the Board asked Mr. Fusco to study the Hambletonian Park water and sewer system to tell us where our problems are and what we can do about them. The Supervisor stated tonight we will be talking about the water system in Section A, this is where the work will begin.

Mr. Fusco explained a lot of the problems that exist were caused by water lines installed too shallow in Section A and also in the same trench as the sewer line, which is no longer allowed. The shallow trench is the main cause of the many water main breaks the Park has been experiencing. He said the plan is to replace about three thousand, nine hundred feet of water main in Section A. This would include Fleetwood Drive, Meadow Brook

Lane, Oakwood and Knapp Terrace. He said also the Town would be continuing the connections to well one and well four. Mr. Fusco explained a new 8 inch Ductile Iron water main will be installed to replace the old asbestos cement water main in Section A. He said these will be laid at least ten feet away from the existing sewer line and will be maintaining an 18 inch separation where the sewer lines and the water lines cross. Mr. Fusco stated all work will be done to Orange County Health Department standards and regulations. He said they will try to decrease any disruption to the community wherever they can. He explained as the pipes are laid the homes will be connected to the new main and when all the connections have been made the old main will be taken out of service.

Mr. Fusco said he is working with the Highway Superintendent as Highway will be resurfacing the roads as the new pipes are laid, so the community will have resurfaced roads also when this is done as Highway is including this work in their road program.

Supervisor Bloomfield asked Councilman Cappella to explain what Highway will be doing with the roads. Councilman Cappella reported every year Highway decides, with the Board what roads will be fixed in the Town. He said this year, due to this project, the money would be best spent in Hambletonian Park. Councilman Cappella said the Highway Superintendent decided to reclaim the roads involved before the contractors come in. He explained that reclaiming involves a big machine coming in that will dig down about four to six inches of black top and mulch it all up and flatten it all out again. When the other work is done the roads will be ready for the blacktop. He explained the roads involved will be Fleetwood, Meadow Brook, Oakwood and part of or all of Knapp. He said this will cost the Town about \$250,000.00 just in black top and the reclaiming.

Pepi Carretero stated he lives on Yankee Main Lane and asked if the Town planned on addressing the drainage problems in the Park when doing the work there. Mr. Fusco said he and the Highway Superintendent had spoken of the drainage as some of the sewer problems have involved drainage. He said they will be looking at this as the work progresses, however anything done at this point would be in Section A only.

Frank DeGeorge said he lives on Magic Circle Drive and he asked if all of Knapp Terrace would be done? Councilman Cappella said he was not really sure. Mr. DeGeorge said he wondered because Knapp Terrace goes all around beyond Section A. Supervisor Bloomfield said he believed the road work would only be in Section A where the other work was being done.

Tony Bair said he had a couple of question and hoped he would not offend anyone. He said Mr. Fusco referred to the way the mains were installed and asked if he would consider this shoddy workmanship and if it is the reason for the problems that exist today? Mr. Fusco replied he was not there for the installation and therefore he can only comment on what he sees, but it appears it was not up to today's standards. Mr. Bair asked what is the life span of an average water main? Mr. Fusco replied an asbestos cement main would be along the line of a forty year life. Mr. Bair said as per New York State 's National Code from 1952, which he received from the Goshen Library, they were very clear on the codes and how the work was done, etc. He said the work should

have been inspected back when this work was done. He said there is a section of the code that states it is the Town's responsibility to inspect those mains as they were installed to see that they were done in a proper fashion. Mr. Bair asked why the homeowner in Hambletonian Park are footing the bill for this when it was a higher authority's responsibility, no offense to this Board. Mr. Bair said "the Town was negligent to inspect the proper installation." He said he has been told there was no code, the code was written and he gave the number of the code.

Supervisor Bloomfield stated he really did not know if there was a code then or if there was a Building Inspector. However, he said by Municipal Law the problem now lies with the residents of the Park. And the problem needs to be fixed.

Mr. Bair said he has a hard time dealing with this, because back then a former Board was trusted to do the right thing. He said the Town issued building permits during this time so therefore there had to be a Building Department and they dropped the ball. He said the code refers to the Town Board as the Administrative Authority, a recognized administrative body, being such, not to offend you, it is your job to protect our health and welfare. He said it was the previous Board's job to protect our health and welfare, they did not. Mr. Bair said there is a lot of "bad stuff" going on here with sewer lines leaking into water lines, etc. and only a part of the system, Section A, is going to be fixed. He said he is in another section, clear on the other side of the park. He said his basement was flooded with sewage on more than one occasion. He said my governing body is not protecting my health and welfare.

Supervisor Bloomfield stated there is an I & I study that is going to be reviewed in the next few weeks and the Board will then spell out exactly what has to be done to the sewer system. He said this all has to be fixed, but Section A was the worse. Mr. Bair asked how long his family would have to live with this sewer problem. Supervisor Bloomfield said he felt it best that the Board address Mr. Bair's problem right a way and he would follow up on this tomorrow morning.

Kevin Loughran, 22 Knapp Terrace, asked if he was in Section A and in the future when other new homes are added, will they be paying into this system as well. Supervisor Bloomfield replied yes and it would be to everyone's advantage to share the burden with more homes.

Christine Jacobson asked Mr. Fusco about the state of the pumping station and what will be the impact on the pumping station when additional houses are added. Supervisor Bloomfield stated this Public Hearing is about water, not sewer. Mr. Fusco answered saying "we have done a preliminary infiltration inflow study". He said they have also done smoke testing and have found there are extraneous ground waters coming into the system. He said by addressing the ground water issue it should alleviate a good amount of the load on the pumping station.

Pepi Carretero asked about the lift station that is in existence and if it would be able to handle the addition of thirty eight homes that are being built. Supervisor Bloomfield

stated the builder who is building those homes will be responsible for upgrading that system if it is insufficient. Mr. Carretero said he did not want to pay a penny for this, since the lift station is sufficient for him.

Ms. Jacobson expressed concern for the additional traffic that may exist if the Town opens the new roads that are being considered. She asked if the newly paved roads will be able to handle the new traffic. Mr. Fusco said the new line will be at a depth that will be able to handle the traffic.

Dan Mateo asked if all the piping had to be prepared properly before the builder could proceed with the 38 new homes. Mr. Bair replied the current plumbing code states that a system has to be up to par with our existing homes, so he said “we all have to be satisfied before we can allow them to go further.” He said it is his understanding the Town wants to connect the two loops that we have to supply these new homes. Mr. Bair asked if the homeowners can stop any thing else that is going on until we can resolve this one issue?

Supervisor Bloomfield said he was not sure and would have to consult legal counsel. However, this work has to be done and the longer it is put off the more costly it will become.

Frank DeGeorge asked why the Town chose a thirty year term for the loan?

Roland Peacock, a Hambletonian Park resident and a banker, explained the longer the loan the larger the amount of interest the residents would be paying.

There were a few other questions that were answered by Mr. Fusco or the Board. One gentleman felt that the homes should be reassessed as anyone wanting to purchase a home in the park would know of the problem and see the construction going on. Councilman Canterino replied saying all of this is improvement and someone purchasing would see it as such.

With no further response from the public, Councilman Lyons made a Motion to close the Public Hearing. The Motion was seconded by Councilman Cappella. Motion carried 4 to 0.

Councilman Lyons made a Motion to accept the Resolution Authorizing Increase and Improvements of Facilities. The Motion was seconded by Councilman Cappella. Motion carried 4 to 0.

WHEREAS, THIS Board has received and reviewed an engineer's map and report concerning the replacement of antiquated water mains, which report includes discussion of necessary excavation, trenching, backfilling, etc. associated with such work within the Town's Water District No. 1, which map and report were prepared Fusco Engineering and Land Surveying, P.E., competent engineers duly licensed in the State of New York; and

WHEREAS, THIS board duly caused the posting and publication of notice of Public Hearing concerning said increase and improvement of facilities of the Water District; and

WHEREAS, said notice specified April 10, 2006 at 7:30 PM, at the Town Hall, as the date, time and place of the Public Hearing and further specified that the maximum estimated cost of said increase and improvement of facilities is \$600,000.00; and

WHEREAS, a Public Hearing was duly held on April 10, 2006 at 7:30, and all persons interested were given an opportunity to be heard.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT, based on the Full EAF and the consulting engineer's report and recommendation, the replacement of the water mains within Water District No. 1 will not have a significant impact on the environment.

IT IS FURTHER RESOLVED that said increase and improvement of facilities is in the public interest and is hereby authorized and approved. Preparation of definite plans and specifications and contracts for the work associated with the replacement of the water mains is directed. All costs and expenses which shall not exceed \$600,000.00 shall be charged against District properties and shall be assessed, levied and collected in the same manner as other charges against the District.

IT IS FURTHER RESOLVED that the Town clerk is directed to record a certified copy of this Resolution in the Orange County Clerk's office within ten (10) days hereof.

That the Town of Goshen hereby awards the bid for the Salesian Park Phase I Improvements De Carvalho Landscaping Service, Inc. in the bid amount of \$644,985.50, minus approximately \$67,160.00 for those items associated with the fountains, making the total \$577,825.50.
