Respected Board Members:

Crush & Varma Law Group, P.C., Goshen, NY ("Our Firm") represents All One One All Farm ("AOOA"), and we are assisting AOOA in getting a Permit for a Farm Distillery from Alcohol and Tobacco Tax and Trade Bureau ("TTB") and Farm Distillery and Micro Rectifier License from New York State Liquor Authority ("NYSLA"). We are conversant with the detail of the permits and licenses applied by AOOA with TTB and NYSLA because we prepared and filed the permit application with TTB and we are in the process of preparing application for licenses from NYSLA.

AOOA objective is to establish a 'farm distillery' as an extension of its farming operations. According to the American Distilling Institute definition, "*Farm distilleries typically produce spirits from grain, potatoes, fruit or sugarcane grown on their farm or brought from local farms. Many of these distilleries not only grow their own ingredients, they also harvest, store and grind them – all in preparation for their final product.*" The distillery license being applied by AOOA is for Farm Distillery, which has restrictions both as to the total production as well as the use of local ingredients in its production.

**TTB Permit:**

The TTB permit application, submitted by AOOA, provides that the **total production of alcohol will be approximately 58 gallons during a 15-day period, i.e. approximately 1,500 gallons per year.** The total capacity of the distillation equipment (Still) being installed by the Farm is merely 20 gallons. Below is the extract of Farm's TTB application showing the total proposed capacity.

Provide the maximum combined number of proof gallons that will be produced, stored, and in transit to the bonded premises during a 15 day period:


**NYSLA licenses:**

AOOA will be applying for a Farm Distillery License (Class D) and Micro-Rectifier's License (class B-1) with NYSLA. It is pertinent to mention here that AOOA's license is NOT a regular Distiller's License (Class A) which would be something obtained by a commercial distillery, has no cap on production volume, and no New York State ingredient requirements as to its products. Farm Distillery License is the lowest volume distillery license currently given by NYSLA, with an annual production limit of 75,000 gallons per annum. Moreover, as submitted in its TTB permit application, AOOA will be equipped to produce, and proposes to produce, only 1,500 gallons in a year. It is also pertinent to note that AOOA's Farm Distillery License requires AOOA to manufacture liquor primarily from farm and food products, as defined in Section 282 (2) of the Agriculture and Markets Law and requires it to use at least 75% New York grown or produced fruits, vegetables, grain and grain products, honey, maple sap or other agricultural products.

In view of the submissions and reasons stated above, AOOA proposed distillery operations are an extension of its farming operations, and not an industrial use.
